

Welcome to the 21st Intercollegiate Dressage Association National Championships. The board of directors are thrilled to once again be hosting this competition at the beautiful Virginia Horse Center in Lexington, VA. The venue and staff are equally wonderful, and I hope you take some time to explore the showgrounds and the amazing views of the surrounding area.

IDA became an official organization in 2001 following several years of unofficial competitions that molded the foundation of the IDA competition format used today. It is an honor to serve on the IDA board; as a founding member, I have served with some fantastic people. The hard work and dedication of the board members have made the IDA an organization of integrity that impacts young people's lives, promotes the sport of dressage, and creates team bonds and healthy competition. This year will see several of our long-standing board members step down to give time to other ambitions in their lives. Please join me in giving a huge thank you to Jackie Yocum and Sarah Simms for their enormous contributions to IDA. We will be electing and welcoming new board members this weekend, which will help to shape the future of IDA, but they undoubtedly will have big shoes to fill.

This weekend's competition will begin on Friday with our USDF/IDA Quiz Challenge participants and Dressage Seat Equitation finalists. Saturday will consist of our Individual test rider qualifiers competing for Individual National Championship titles at four levels. The Trip Harting Memorial Trophy, in honor of dressage judge and IDA supporter, will be awarded to the Individual National Champion at First level. The Mary Beth Mclean Trophy, honoring a former Saint Andrews University Instructor, will be awarded to the Introductory Level Individual National Champion. The competition culminates on Sunday with the Team Championship competing for the National Title and the Beukema National Title, designed by Trotting Horse Workshop and named in honor of Beth Beukema, who served as the first IDA president for 17 years. The Reserve National Champion team will take home the Reserve National Champion Trophy designed by Geoff Hergth and named in honor of Michelle Hoffman, a former student of Mount Holyoke College who was integral in the concept idea of IDA.

A few other awards will be presented this weekend to recognize outstanding coaches, 2 and 4 legged, and outstanding service to the association:

- The Teresa McDonald coach of the year trophy in memory of founding IDA member and longtime Virginia Tech IDA coach "T" McDonald.
- The Malloot Trophy in remembrance of Emory & Henry College IDA horse Malloot, will be awarded to the horse voted on as MVH of the National Show.
- The KTB Creative Group Spirit Award, presented to the team at IDA nationals that embodies the true spirit of the sport.
- Hall of Fame awarded to a member who has made significant contributions to the association.
- Coach of the Year awarded to an outstanding coach of the organization.

I would like to give a huge thank you to all of our sponsors; we cannot do this without you! Many of our sponsors are here this weekend, so please thank and support our generous sponsors.

A SPECTATORS GUIDE TO DRESSAGE

THE DRESSAGE TEST

The dressage tests today are part of the basic training scale that dressage riders use to school their horses from training level through the highest level of competition, the "Grand Prix" dressage, as performed in the Olympic Games. The training begins with free, forward movement of the horse, relaxation and swing through the back and acceptance of the contact. In this weekend's Intercollegiate Dressage Competition the tests ridden range from walk/trot to first level. The riders and horses perform a series of set patterns at walk, trot, and canter in a 20 x 40 meter or 20 x 60-meter arena. The movements range from 20-meter circles, lengthening the horse's stride across a diagonal, halts, counter canter, and transitions from one gait to another. Leg yielding, where the horse moves sideways and forward simultaneously is shown in the first level tests.

JUDGING THE TESTS

Today two judges will preside at the competition arena with the scores averaged for the final tally. Each movement in the test receives a mark from 0-10, with a 5 or 6 being an average score and a 7 or 8 denoting a fairly good or good performance. The final scores are calculated as a percentage of the total points and the winning rides will usually receive a score in the 62-72% range.

One of the most challenging aspects of IDA competition is that the riders are allowed only a 10-minute timed warm-up to become acquainted with their mounts before entering the arena in front of the judge. Dressage is primarily judged on the horse's movements, but today the skill and the influence of the riders will be shown in the test results. For the team competition the horses are grouped by the horse selection committee, and the teams draw groups of four horses that are assigned to the riders by the coaches.

REMINDER: Please do not speak with riders once they are in the competition ring. This is considered unauthorized assistance and may cause the elimination of the rider.

CODE OF CONDUCT & MISSION

IDA Code of Conduct:

Intercollegiate Dressage Association (IDA) Members, including riders, coaches, officials, and volunteers must conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner, and are responsible for their actions in competitions, going to and from competitions, and while at areas hosting competitions. Members are responsible for adherence to IDA competition rules and procedures. IN all equestrian sports the well-being of the horse shall be above the demands of trainers, riders, owners, organizers, sponsors, or officials. IN the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider are essential. All riding and training methods must demonstrate respect for the horse as a living entity and may not include any technique considered to be abusive or overtaxing of the horse's ability or fitness.

NOTE: Anyone may approach the steward or show management to report violations(s) to the IDA Code of Conduct. Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in disqualification from an event, loss of points earned at the event, and possibly prevent participation in future IDA events at the discretion of show management, show steward, and/or IDA Board.

Mission:

The mission of IDA is to introduce students to the equestrian discipline of dressage and to foster continued development, understanding, and appreciation in the art of dressage through organized student competitions and educational opportunities.

Please note the following:

- ASTM/SEI approved headgear is required for all riders and must be worn while mounted.
- The show will be run according to USEF rules.
- Entry Fees and Liability Release forms must be collected before the competition begins.






