From the President

Dear Competitors, Coaches, Family, Friends and IDA Alumni,

Welcome to the Intercollegiate Dressage Associations 23rd National Championship! Along with the entire IDA board, I am so excited to be collaborating for the second year in a row with the Interscholastic Equestrian Associations National Champions here in St. Louis Missouri. I hope you will enjoy all that the National Equestrian Center and St Louis has to offer while you are here.

The riders competing at Nationals have earned their spot here through hard work, dedication and talent to finish at the top of their respected regions. I am looking forward to watching all of their rides this weekend.

This week's competition will begin on Wednesday with our **USDF/IDA Quiz Challenge** finalists; these students have made it through two rounds of quizzes on dressage training principals and USDF rules to qualify for the final round this week.

Thursday will consist of our individual test ride qualifiers from each region competing for Individual National Championship titles at four levels. **The Trip Harting Memorial Trophy**, in honor of dressage judge and IDA supporter, is awarded to the Individual National Champion at First level. **The Mary Beth Mclean Trophy**, honoring a former Saint Andrews University Instructor, will be awarded to the Introductory Level Individual National Champion.

Team competition gets underway on Friday, where 12 teams will be competing for the National Title and the **Beukema Trophy**, designed by Trotting Horse Workshop and named in honor of Beth Beukema, who served as the first IDA president for 17 years. The Reserve National Champion team will take home the **Reserve National Champion Trophy** designed by Geoff Hergh and named in honor of Michelle Hoffman, a former student of Mount Holyoke College who was integral in the concept idea of IDA.

Saturday will round out this year's Championships with riders competing in the **Dressage Seat Equitation** classes for National honors.

IDA became an official organization in 2001 following several years of unofficial competitions that molded the foundation of the IDA competition format used today. It is an honor to serve on the IDA board; as a founding member, I have served with many fantastic people. The hard work and dedication of the board members have made the IDA an organization of integrity that promotes the sport of dressage, and creates lasting bonds among our students. The board will present the Hall of Fame award to a member who has made significant contributions to the association.

Our team's coaches are an amazing group of equestrian professionals, cherished by their students. Each year we receive numerous heart-felt letters from students nominating their coach for the coach of the year award. **The Teresa McDonald Coach of The Year Trophy**, in memory of founding IDA member and longtime Virginia Tech IDA coach "T" McDonald, will be presented to this year's coach of the year.

Our most cherished teachers have four legs, and each year **The Malloot Trophy** is awarded to the Most Valuable horse at the Nationals Competition in remembrance of Emory & Henry College's IDA horse Malloot, and all of our IDA horses past and present.

Be on the lookout for team spirit and put in a word for the team you feel should receive **The KTB Creative Group Spirit Award**, presented to the team at IDA nationals that embodies the true spirit of the sport.

I would like to give a huge thank you to all of our generous sponsors; we cannot do this without you! Many of our sponsors are here this weekend, so please thank and support our sponsors. Please also join me in thanking the collaborative effort of the colleges and individuals who brought horses for the competition this week.

Code of Conduct & Mission

IDA Code of Conduct:

Intercollegiate Dressage Association (IDA) Members, including riders, coaches, officials, and volunteers, must conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner, and are responsible for their actions in competitions, going to and from competitions, and while at arenas hosting competitions. Members are responsible for adherence to IDA competition rules and procedures. IN all equestrian sports the well-being of the horse shall be above the demands of trainers, riders, owners, organizers, sponsors, or officials. IN the interests of the horse, the fitness and competence of the rider are essential. All riding and training methods must demonstrate respect for the horse as a living entity and may not include any technique considered to be abusive or overtaxing of the horse's ability or fitness.

NOTE: Anyone may approach a steward or show management to report violation(s) to the IDA Code of Conduct. Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in disqualification from an event, loss of points earned at the event, and possibly prevent participation in future IDA events at the discretion of show management, show steward, and/or IDA Board.

IDA Mission:

The mission of IDA is to introduce students to the equestrian discipline of dressage and to foster continued development, understanding, and appreciation in the art of dressage through organized student competitions and educational opportunities.



Please note the following:

- **ASTM/SEI approved headgear is required for all riders and must be worn while mounted.**
- **The show will be run according to USEF rules.**
- **Entry fees and liability release forms must be collected before the competition begins.**

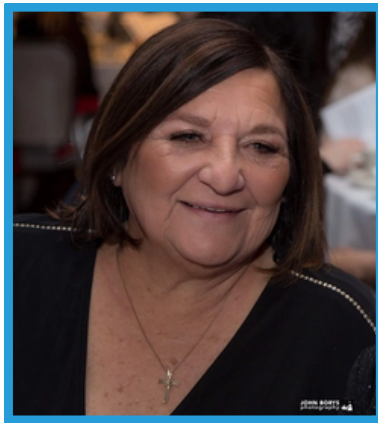


Meet the Officials
